Old Business

Law Enforcement Subcommittee Report – Chris Blievernicht reviewed the minutes of the April 2022 meeting.

Fire/EMS Subcommittee Report – William Fabijancic reviewed the minutes of the May 2022 meeting.

Central Dispatch Operational Report (Kelley)

- Telecommunicator Brown graduated from LCC with a degree in business management. Telecommunicator Kelley is working on her bachelor's degree from Ferris State for criminal justice. She is working as an intern with Kelley and Francis on her days off.
- Telecommunicator Brian Jones joined the CTO team.
- Telecommunicator Supervisors Thacker and Carranco lead the tactical team. They have been tasked with recruiting telecommunicators for the team and preparing the communications trailer. Kelley offered their services for when agencies are at a scene for a long time. They can bring out the communications trailer or the Tahoe.

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- An update of the two telecommunicators in the training program was given. There were three, but one recently resigned.
- The hiring process is going on right now. There are two openings. That will put us at 15 dispatchers and 6 supervisors.

Central Dispatch Project Updates

- Curbside SOS meets with Kelley and Francis next week. They have been working with the County's GIS to get the mapping done. Kelley explained what Curbside SOS is.
- ASAP to PSAP has been a struggle for the last two years because the information goes through LEIN. Nathan from Technology Services has been working with the State and there are just a few minor details to work out. Kelley hopes to know more next week and when we can go live with ASAP to PSAP.
- An overview of the budget was given. A data channel was put in the budget. She explained what it would do. Ingham County has already put a data channel on our towers and it's possible that we could just use theirs. She will do a Good of Service report to find out.
- Kelley has been going to township/city/village meetings to talk about our millage that will be on the August ballot. She is stressing the difference between the millage and the radio surcharge.
- RAVE Facility is like a Smart 911 profile for a business. They can upload information in it to help us when they call 911. The public relation team is working on creating an information sheet to give out to businesses.
- RAVE Collaborate is for certain events for check lists. It could be used for SRT call outs and AVI. Let Kelley know if you are interested in it.
- New CAD – Kelley will be putting a committee together to look at a new CAD later this Summer. Our current CAD is supported but only for a few more years. Undersheriff Cook wondered if a new CAD would integrate with the current RMS and JMS or if we would need a new suite. Kelley stated that it is possible for different vendors to integrate with each other. Kelley stated that she will definitely include ECSO in shopping for a new CAD.
