New Business

Situational Awareness Overview

- PFAS collection (See attached document from the Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE))
- High-Hazard Flammable Trains (HHFTs) Reports – We have started to receive monthly reports about High Hazard Flammable Trains (HHFTs) that travel through Eaton County on a monthly basis. A High Hazard Flammable Train (HHFT § 171.8 Definitions and abbreviations): “means a single train transporting 20 or more loaded tank cars of a Class 3 flammable liquid in a continuous block or a single train carrying 35 or more loaded tank cars of a Class 3 flammable liquid throughout the train consist.” Attached is the latest report from earlier this month.
- Vehicle in the Thornapple River incident on 2/7/20

On Friday, February 7, 2020, Sgt. Bricker with the Eaton County Sheriff's Office notified Eaton County Emergency Management of a vehicle that crashed into the Thornapple River with possible fluid leaking. Eaton County Emergency Management notified the Drain Commissioner's Office and they promptly went to the area to check. Upon arrival, the Drain Commissioners Office determined that there was very minimal to no fluid leak or sheen on the water. The vehicle was safely removed from the river.

Online Tier II Manager Subscription

We are now subscribers to Online Tier II Manager through EGLE. Online Tier II Manager is how all facilities that are required to report hazardous chemical storage and inventory under the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA Title III) submit their annual or updated reports. This creates one repository for us to keep track of the chemicals in those facilities and minimizes receiving multiple paper copies of reports on an annual basis.

The Delta Township Fire Department and Grand Ledge Area Emergency Services Authority have also subscribed as system users.
