MINUTES

The June 7, 2021 regular meeting of the Health and Human Services Committee was called to order at 9:00 am by Chairperson Mott.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given by all.

There were no proposed changes to the presented agenda.

Commissioner Rogers moved to approve the minutes of the May 3, 2021 Meeting, as presented. Commissioner Pearl-Wright seconded. Motion carried by unanimous roll call vote.

A summary of the FY22 juvenile millage program funding requests was presented and discussed. The requested continuation program funding totals \$337,000 in juvenile millage funds to support \$495,300 in program expenditures including applicable State Child Care Fund matching funds. Discussion held.

Christy Harry, Housing-Services Mid-Michigan was present to provide an overview of the agency's request for funding for the Shared Housing Intervention Program (SHIP).

Melissa Threadould, Community Mental Health was present to provide an overview of the agency's request for funding for the Parent-Young Child Program.

Harriet Dean and Kim Thalison, Eaton Regional Education Service Agency were present to provide an overview of the agency's request for the Truancy Intervention Program (TIP).

The consensus of the Committee was to recommend the millage program requests be referred to the Ways and Means Committee for inclusion in the FY22 Budget.


A summary of the FY22 Tri-County Office on Aging Annual Implementation Plan was presented and discussed.

Commissioner Mulder moved to recommend approval of a resolution approving the FY22 Annual Implementation Plan to the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Pearl-Wright seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

A resolution approved by the Huron County Board of Commissioners opposing state legislative proposals to privately the public mental health system was presented. Discussion held. Clinton-Eaton-Ingham Community Mental Health Authority will be invited to the next regular meeting to discuss the proposed legislation.

Chairperson Mott adjourned the meeting at 9:48 a.m.
